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1 Executive Summary

The ODYSSEA final conference was held as a virtual event on 2-3 November.

An internal ODYSSEA Virtual General Assembly Meeting was held on Tuesday 2nd November 2021 using Zoom. The purpose was to inform partners of the end of project reporting requirements, discussed pending deliverables and to fine tune the agenda for the main Final Conference to take place on Wednesday 3rd November 2021.

The main Final Conference was an open session and was held on Wednesday 3rd November 2021.

The purpose of the conference was to present the key ODYSSEA outputs and results to key target audiences including project partners, the scientific community, marine-based industry (including SMEs), policymakers, public authorities, media, consumer organisations and the general public. The meeting was held via Zoom. Participants were required to pre-register to attend the meeting.

The final conference was promoted widely on the project's website, across social media and through the extended networks of the project and its consortia.

325 individuals registered to attend the Final Conference, 164 of registrants participated in the meeting in 433 sessions for a total of 640 hours.



2 Internal ODYSSEA Virtual General Assembly Meeting, 2nd November 2021

2.1 Introduction

An internal ODYSSEA Virtual General Assembly Meeting was held on Tuesday 2nd November 2021 using Zoom. The meeting was attended at least 1 representative from each of 28 beneficiaries. The purpose was to inform partners of the end of project reporting requirements, discussed pending deliverables and to fine tune the agenda for the main Final Conference to take place on Wednesday 3rd November 2021.

2.2.1 Final Project Reporting and timelines

The Final Report will have to be submitted within 60 days after the end of the project, i.e until 31st January and WP leaders will need therefore to prepare a full draft version of the Narrative technical report before the Christmas holidays.

The financial report will also need to be sent early to mid-January and partners who require an audit will need to contact them very soon, possibly within this month.

Templates will be sent for both Narrative and Technical Reports.

Final batch of payment will be made after Final Technical and Financial report are submitted to and approved by the REA services.

2.2.2 Status of pending project deliverables

Each pending deliverable was discussed, and all involved partners confirmed that they would be able to submit them until the formal closure of the project, November 30th.

2.2.3 The open session section of the Final Conference agenda and presentations

The Agenda of the Open Session (Wednesday, 3rd November) was reviewed and fine-tuned. It was agreed that Partners would need to take into account that the session was targeting a very broad, diverse and numerous audience (with already almost 300 registrations) and avoid raising issues that do not add value



in such a context while Speakers would have to make sure that they do not exceed the time allocated and give lively presentations.
