



Protocol Kick-off meeting

Deliverable WP 12.1







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1. Executive Summary

The ODYSSEA project held its opening conference in the city of Kavala, Greece June 6–8, 2017. The Democritus University of Thrace (DUTH), which leads the project, hosted representatives from the consortium's 28 partner organizations including research institutes, universities, policy makers, non-governmental organizations and SMEs from 14 EU and non-EU countries across the Mediterranean. In addition to the consortium members and students from DUTH, Prof. Vicente Pérez Muñuzuri and Prof. Aldo Drago participated from the external Advisory Board and Mr. Gonzalo Garcia de Arboleya, the Project Officer nominated by the Commission also took part in all the meetings. All participants became acquainted with each other and assured strong support and close collaboration during project implementation. In addition to clarifications of specific aspects of project implementation, setting action items and follow up meetings, a set of four working groups, related to project's WP blocks, was established and the groups had their first meetings in parallel sessions. The governance structure was officially established and processes were confirmed by the consortium. The agenda detailing the sessions is an annex to this deliverable and the summary of meetings is shared with all partners.

2. ODYSSEA Kick-off Meeting Protocol

During the Kick-off meeting (KoM), the Consortium discussed the project planning, addressed important questions and worked in separate groups on the first steps of project implementation. As a result of the three days, a set of action items ("AI") were compiled and require follow up. Some of these AIs are clarifications of the DoA. Others are key issues which emerged as requiring attention during the ODYSSEA Kick-off Meeting. Last, but not least, there is a table listing AIs which detail the specific and immediate next steps in implementing our project.

The clarifications of the DoA as well as the key issues are described below. They are followed by a table of action items including the person responsible and due date for each. Additionally, the next planned meetings are listed as well as the working groups established and decisions reached. The full set of project deliverables including due dates



and a designated responsible person for each is presented as a separate excel spread sheet.

Task forces will be appointed to prepare the completions to the DoA mentioned above. The task force leaders will prepare the first draft of the clarifications and completions by mid-September and distribute them to the members of the task force for review and input. By mid-October, each task force will distribute its draft to the entire consortium and the task force leaders will present them to the consortium during the partner meeting in Rome on October 26 and 27.

A. Clarifications of the DoA

Based on discussions at the KOM several issues require further detail and clarification; pertinent action items are included in the AI table below.

1. ODYSSEA observatories: set up, operation, maintenance

This set of protocols will include, among others, logistics, equipment, models to run, regulations for each observatory. This task force will be led by Georgios (DUTH) and the force includes Marco (UNIBO), Nikos/Katerina (FORTH) and Houssine (AGIR).

2. Platform release dates – schedule of the platform 'product' starting from early mock up version to the fully functional platform including dates/timeline/description of functionality

This task force will be led by Ghada (Deltares), and the force includes Nicolas (CLS) and Eduard (gtd). Within this planning process, platform development must be integrated with other project milestones and all technology developers must be included: Deltares, CLS, Hidromod, gtd, Edisoft, Thales, Technion, BLIT as well as Alseamar, Leitat and Develogic



3. Define indicators and benchmarks of success for various stages of project

These will be linked with the existing project milestones and timeframes. This activity will be led by the PE with assistance of at least one representative from each block.

B. Key Issues

Based on discussions at the KOM several issues require further detail and clarification; pertinent action items are included in the table below.

1. ODYSSEA Products and Services offered to a range of end users

This will include a list of potentially valuable and novel products and services that can be offered to the end-users, using the data provided by existing systems (Copernicus, EuroGOOS, EMODnet, etc) and ODYSSEA-generated data (observations and forecasts). The ODYSSEA platform and local sales points will be used for this task. This key issue is related to WP8 in general and Tasks 8.3 & 8.5 in conjunction with Task 9.1. This activity will be driven by Ghada (Deltares), Georgios (DUTH), Adelio (Hidromod), Nicolas (CLS) and Simon (AP).

2. Local Sales representatives for EU and North African countries

Local sales points will be established through ODYSSEA Observatory leaders in the Med EU partner countries, in Northern Africa and the Middle East. This action is linked with the previous issue and it will serve to support the Med EU and North African partners in engagement with their national levels of stakeholders. Justifications for the authorities in the North African countries to support the establishment of ODYSSEA Observatories, will be tailored to the specific needs, interests and circumstances of each country. This support will include letters to specific governments provided by the Greek national authorities and EU agencies. This key issue is related to Task 9.1 the activity will be driven by Lauren (WCMC), Arslan (NSV), Georgios (DUTH), Menelaos (DUTH), and Simon (AP).



3. Setting up the Innovation Board

This activity will promote the exploitation and commercialisation of the novel products and services that will be developed throughout the project. This activity is related to WP9 and WP11, though no particular task is associated with it. The Innovation Board is described in the DoA as part of the Project Management. This activity will be driven by Yann (CLS) and Simon (AP). All commercial entities within ODYSSEA (CLS, Thales, Edisoft, gtd, Alseamar, develogic, Hidromod, BLIT) as well as all entities that generate IP, such as LEITAT, will participate in this activity.
